- Affected SST(shallow shouted tubewell)/VST (very shouted tubewell) - 55

- Forest: US\$ 5.6 Million
- Death of wild life (deer): 24
- Roads and Highways: US\$2.6 million
- BWDB- embankments, sluice gates, riverbank protection structure: US\$27.0 million

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Needs and priorities

Short-term (upto 1 month)

- Search & Rescue
- Providing burial services
- Updating death toll
- Providing first aid to the injured
- Disposal of carcass
- Restoration of emergency services such as road & telecommunication and power service
- Emergency relief – food including baby food, drinking water, WPT, clothes (sari, lungi), blanket, bed sheet, mosquito net, tent etc.
- Cleaning/repairing drinking water sources
- Providing water treatment facilities
- Damage and loss assessment

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Needs and priorities

Medium term (1-4 months) (Dec-March)

- Continue food support
- Warm clothing
- House building assistance
- Reopening educational institutions
- Preventing outburst of epidemics
- Sinking of tube wells
- Repairing roads, culverts, bridges etc.

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Needs and priorities

Long term (>4 months)

- Rehabilitation of Sundarban
- Construction and reconstruction of coastal embankments, polders, sluice gates etc.
- Coastal afforestation
- Construction of cyclone shelters
- Improving early warning system
- Expansion of CPP operations
- Expansion of disaster management information network
- Improving Early Warning System

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Special VGF Programme

- Special VGF programme from December 2007 in highly effected 12 districts.
- 15kg rice per VGF card will be provided against 2.59 million cards up to March, 2008.
- 5000 cards per union/municipality in each of four mostly affected districts.
- 2500 cards per union/municipality in each of rest of the districts.
- Total number of union/municipality- 790
- Total requirement for four months -150,233 MT

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Relief Priority

- Food Grain is the Priority
- Total food requirement 1 Million MT
- GoB aims to procure 500,000 MT
- GoB expects external food support of 500,000 MT
- Rice should not be procured from local market
- National Food Security Reserve 1.00 Mil. MT
- All assistance should be chanelised through government.

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International Assistance Coordination

- Emergency Response Coordination Cell in operation in the Ministry
- Sub-Cell at Zia International Air Port to receive Relief goods
- Sub-Cell at Barisal Airport
- Measures taken to send relief goods to the Districts directly from Air Port
