**Summary of Cyclone Situation**

Updated official report from MoFDM illustrates that the number of death caused by tropical cyclone 'SIDR' has risen to **2982 affecting 6.7 million** people of **1.5 million** families. These casualties and damages of houses, livestock, crops, educational institutions, roads and embankments have been reported from 1726 unions of 200 upazilas of 30 districts. Most deaths and damages have been attributed to the storm surge.

Today Bangladesh Air Force has sent 18 missions carrying 51 MT relief items mainly food stuffs. Out of them 14 helicopter missions carried 31MT, 02 AC-130 carried 10MT and 02 N-32 aircraft carried 10MT to affected districts.

GoB have allocated approx 2.4 million USD from Honorable Chief Advisor's Relief & Welfare Fund and DRR, MoFDM for the Sidr victims. GoB has also allocated 7070 MT GR Rice, distributing 27,000 food bags, 18,000 blankets, 7,500 tents, 3,300 utensils and 13,000 bundles of CI sheets by the Directorate of Relief and Rehabilitation (DRR).

UN Agencies are continuing their assistance in damage assessment and relief operation. The joint UN Govt. assessment team completed work after visiting worst affected districts.

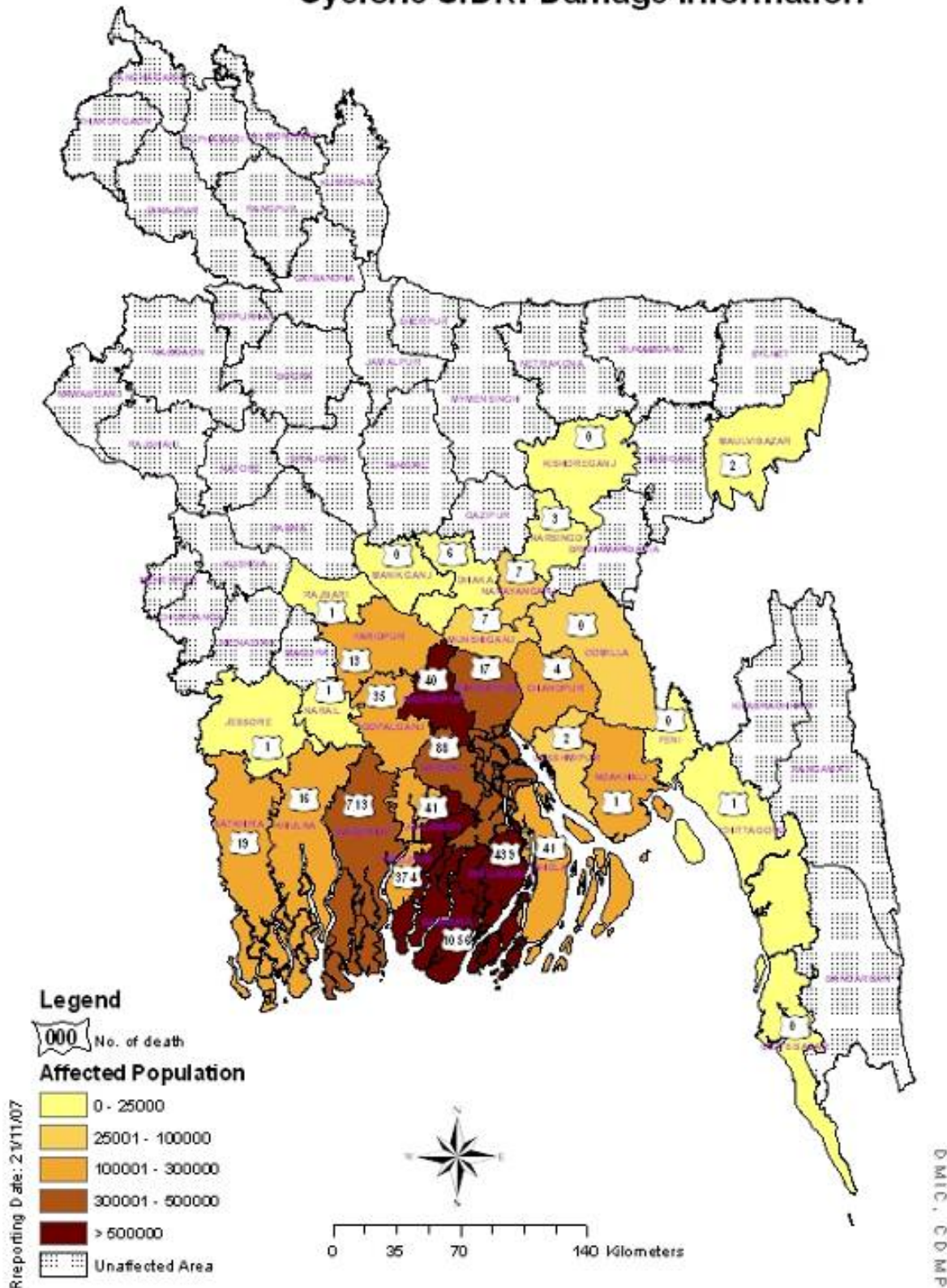
**Future Actions:**

The most affected areas of the Sidr in terms of deaths are Borguna, Bagerhat, Patuakhali and Pirozpur. Other most affected districts are Barisal, Khulna, Satkhira, Jhalokathi, Bhola, Madaripur, Gopalganj, Shariatpur etc.

**Relief Activities due to Cyclone SIDR**

- 4896 plastic and 2600 cotton tents were allocated to Bagerhat, Patuakhali, Borguna and Pirozpur provided by the Royal Saudi Government.
- 135 pcs tents, 100 bags rice, 182 carton food items, 70 carton and 10 bags medicines counted in the relief items contributed by the Government of Pakistan and counting is continuing.

**Contribution of different Governments/ International Agencies**

**European Commission**

The European Commission launched a second humanitarian decision for €5 million on November 19, 2007 to help victims of Cyclone Sidr. The proposed new emergency funding comes on top of €1.5 million in fast-track aid allocated on Friday, November 16, 2007 and would bring the total Commission contribution to 6.5 million euros so far. The new funds will meet vital needs for water, food, shelter and household items such as soap, cooking utensils and jerrycans. Commission humanitarian funds are managed by its Humanitarian Aid department (ECHO) and channeled through partner implementing agencies including non-governmental organizations that specialize in international relief, United Nations agencies and the Red Cross/Crescent movement.

### Government of Switzerland

The Government of Switzerland has provided 200,000 Swiss Francs (US\$ 160,000) in grants for relief materials for the cyclone-hit people of Bangladesh as an emergency response.

The relief materials would be distributed through Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) and Swiss Red Cross (SRC) in 5 districts - Bagerhat, Pirozpur, Patuakhali, Jhalokathhi and Madaripur.

7,800 families in these 5 districts will receive food, temporary shelter materials, kitchen sets and clothes. The relief operation is expected to start on Thursday, 22 November 2007.

### Government of Australia

The Australian Government has announced that it would provide Taka 180 million (A\$3 million) for emergency relief and recovery efforts in communities affected by Cyclone Sidr.

Announcing the decision, the Australian High Commissioner, Doug Foskett, advised that, through its international aid agency, AusAID, Australia will contribute A\$1million each to:

- Australian NGOs working in Bangladesh for relief assistance including the provision of safe water, sanitation facilities and non-food items such as clothes and blankets;
- the World Food Program (WFP) to meet immediate food needs and support recovery programs; and
- the International Federation of the Red Cross to support the Bangladesh Red Crescent Societies' relief efforts, including basic health care and emergency sanitation.
