Summary of Cyclone Sidr Response

Updated official report from MoFDM illustrates that the number of death caused by tropical cyclone 'SIDR' has risen to **3292 affecting 8.6 million** people of **2.0 million** families. These casualties and damages of houses, livestock, crops, educational institutions, roads and embankments have been reported from 1888 unions of 200 upazilas of 30 districts. Most deaths and damages have been attributed to the storm surge.

AFD is working on non-stop basis and carrying the relief goods to the local administrations, communities at the very remote locations by both BAF and US Aircrafts. Yesterday BAF, USAF, US Marine carried 46213 kg relief items to cyclone affected areas by 09 sorties.

Up to Saturday, December 01, 2007 GoB have allocated approx 507 million BDT from Honorable Chief Advisor's Relief & Welfare Fund and DRR, MoFDM for the Sidr victims. GoB has also allocated 16890 MT GR Rice, distributed 27,000 food bags, 26700 blankets, 16454 tents, 3,348 utensils and 13,000 bundles of CI sheets by the Directorate of Relief and Rehabilitation (DRR).

Actions Taken:

- BDT 500000 G. R Cash has been allocated to the Relief and Coordination cell in Barisal district for Rescue and relief operations.
- Last 29th November, 2007 BDT 300 million has been allocated to the highly affected 9 districts as a house building grant from **Chief Adviser's Relief and Welfare Fund**.
- Medicine 48 packets, Alam Feric 40 packets, ready food 333 packets, water filter 5000pcs, Milk powder 666 packets blanket 6000 pcs from the contribution of India Government have been hand over to the Armed Forces for distributing to the affected people.
- Work for cleaning 2 ponds and establishing 12 ringwells have been taken in Dublarchar.

Situation Report

- Water is being supplied in Khulna by 38 High Density Plastic (HDP) mobile tanks capable of containing 500 liters of water.
- 7 mobile water treatment plants out of 10 are functioning. 1 unit will be sent to Patharghata and other 2 units will be activated soon.
- In Patuakhali 133 ponds of different upazilas were cleaned by Department of Public Health Engineering and are being used for household works. Other unclean ponds are not being used.
- In Gopalganj, Madaripur and Shariatpur 106 ponds of different upazilas were cleaned by Department of Public Health Engineering and are being used for household works. Other unclean ponds are not being used.

Operations by Armed Forces Divisions (AFD)

BAF operated 05 sorties yesterday. C-130 and AN-32 are used to carry relief items to the affected areas.

USAF and US Marine scheduled to carry relief items (food, blanket, shelters and clo) by operating 9-11XC-130.

US Marine scheduled to operate 12XCH-53 to carry relief items (Water Purification Tab, Food and Shelter) to the affected areas. Also they will send Mobile Medical team and 4XCH-46 used.

Cyclone Sidr Disaster Response from Concern Worldwide, Bangladesh

2 December, 2007

Concern Worldwide, Bangladesh has deployed Concern staff and partner organisation staff to distribute relief to the affected and extremely poor families, keeping in mind the need to avoid duplication with relief operations by other NGOs.

Concern with funding from ECHO (Euro 580,000), People in Need (€18,000) and Irish Aid (€100,000) started relief operations in Barguna and Patuakhali districts for 26,000 extreme poor families from 24th November and this phase of relief will be completed by 3rd December. It has been estimated that over 250 thousand families have been affected in these two districts. Concern sets priority to assist those families who have the least coping capacity and in areas where the response by other organisations may be limited. The relief package being given includes both food and non-food material. The relief package fixed according to International Sphere Standards will provide food for 15 days for each family. The relief operation will be implemented through three partner organisations – Speed Trust (Patuakhali) , Dhaka Ahsania Mission- DAM (Barguna) and Sangram (Barguna). As of 2nd December 07 i.e. today, relief has been given to 25,402 families (16,000 in Barguna and 9402 in Patuakhali).
