Summary of Cyclonic Storm "AILA"

Current Situation

The death toll due to the cyclone AILA reached 190. Many areas of the affected districts were inundated and houses, roads and embankments were damaged. Relief efforts are continuing in all affected districts with some early recovery underway. Restoring water supplies in these areas remains a priority. As of June 10, 2009 total 27951 MT GR Rice, BDT 13,13,81,000 as GR Cash and BDT 20,02,92,000 as house building grant have been allocated along with BDT 60,60,000 BDT for relief transportation.

The DER Shelter Working Group has met to discuss the situation and current challenges faced in the shelter sector post-Aila. At the last meeting on 9 June it was decided that three sub groups would be established (1) to develop technical specifications and minimum standards for facilitating the construction of transitional shelters; (2) to support advocacy and information management; and (3) for the development of strategic advice. To better coordinate both current relief and future early recovery shelter activity, it was further agreed that all members would provide the SWG secretariat with information in 3Ws Format on their interventions for compilation and dissemination.

The WASH cluster/ working group are doing assessment for further assistance regarding water and sanitation. A rough estimate indicates about 500,000 to 750,000 people are seeking immediate water supply and sanitation supports. Most of the ponds have saline water contamination making them unfit to support drinking and other domestic water supply for the communities. Water purification is carried out by agencies such as CARE/Oxfam GB, DPHE, Save the Children USA,

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WVI. Bangladesh Army is also supporting water trucking to the locations those are difficult to reach by other agencies. Beside providing pure water many WASH working group agencies are working on restoration of potable water sources by dewatering/disinfecting ponds and tube-wells.

Different Organization's Response

BRAC

BRAC is continuing to provide emergency relief support in Bagerhat, Khulna and Sathkira. As of June 9, 2009 evening (from 26th June 2009) BRAC has provided emergency support in the following ways:

- Safe water supply to 43,951 families in Shyamnagar and Ashashuni under Sathkira; Koira, Paikgacha and Dacope under Khulna by boats.
- Food packets (consists of 5 kg rice, 1 kg dal, 0.5 L cooking oil, 0.5 kg salt, 1 kg potato, matches, 4 ORS sachets) to 10,878 families. Food has been purchased yesterday and will be distributing from today onwards.
- 5,000 polythene (plastic) sheets for those who have sought refuge on embankments, roads or other high ground and considering the ground situation we will be distributing a further 4000 plastic sheets to Khulna and Sathkira for emergency shelters which have been purchased yesterday and will be distributing from today onwards.
- 28 ponds have been dewatered, 10 ponds are being dewatered in Bagerhat district and there is a demand for dewatering another 2 ponds which were inundated with saline water. As the people of these areas have moved to a recovery phase, we are giving more focus in dewatering ponds to ensure a continuous source.
- Considering nutrition intake of children in the affected areas, BRAC has distributed biscuits (3 packs along with 0.5 L water) to 3,775 children in Khulna, Bagerhat and Sathkira
- BRAC has stopped distributing dry food to the Aila affected areas. Earlier BRAC has distributed dry food packets to 34,308 families.

Save the Children Alliance

SC is currently managing emergency operations out of three fully-operational Emergency Control Centers in Bhola, Barisal, Khulna and Patuakhali districts. To date, SC provided support to AILA victims with safe drinking water, food, child protection, emergency non-food items and other relief. SC has provided 6,000 families with non-food item kits. Each kit contains water containers, a plastic sheet and rope for temporary shelter, a candle, a family-sized mosquito net, a blanket and hygiene items. Additionally, immediately after the cyclone SC distributed food rations to 260 families in Char Fashion Upazilla, Bhola district. Each family received 5 kg rice, 1 kg pulses, 1.5 liters oil and 1 kg salt. SC continues to operate five water purification plants in the most-affected areas, providing daily drinking water supplies to an estimated 17,000 families living in Barguna, Patuakhli and Bhola districts. A total of 1.2 million liters of drinking water have been distributed to date. Additionally, 15,000 water purification tablets were provided to 1,500 families. To help families to disinfect overflowed latrines and other waste left behind by the cyclone, SC distributed 600 KG of bleaching powder. SC is currently conducting a Water and Sanitation Needs Assessment in 14 selected unions to prioritize additional needs. SC is operating one water ambulance which, in cooperation with the local government, has transported nine health teams to cyclone-affected chars. Distribution of Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) to treat diarrhea is ongoing, with 8,000 sachets distributed to 800 families in Borobaishdia and Rangabali unions to date. SC has established 25 child-friendly spaces (CFS) which are providing support and protection to an estimated 2,250 children. Start up activities are underway to establish an additional 75 spaces in Borguna, Patuakhali, Khulna and Satkhira districts. SC UK is the Co-lead of the Education Cluster which is currently comprised of over 25 member organizations, including NGOs, INGOs, Donors and Government. The cluster has completed mapping of agencies planning a response in education and a Rapid Education Assessment.

Uttaran

Uttaran started emergency support in 5 upazilas of Khulna and Shatkhira on May 27, 2009. After disaster Uttaran has distributed dry food, drinking water, child food, jarican, WBT, ORS, manpower as organizational ability. Following is the vrief relief activities:

- o Each packet consists of Chira (2 km, Gur 500gm and bus cite for children 90 gm).
- o 5 number of ORS and 5 number of WBT distributed to each family.
- o Uttaran is continuing to distribute water directly to the isolated villages by boats. Uttaran is distributing 9000 liter of water to Shamnagar and 6000 to Ashsoni Upazila, each day. This supply will continuing till stabilizes in those areas.
- o After AILA, Uttaran immediately has provided funeral clothes for dead body.
- o Uttaran has provided 250 manpower for polder construction.

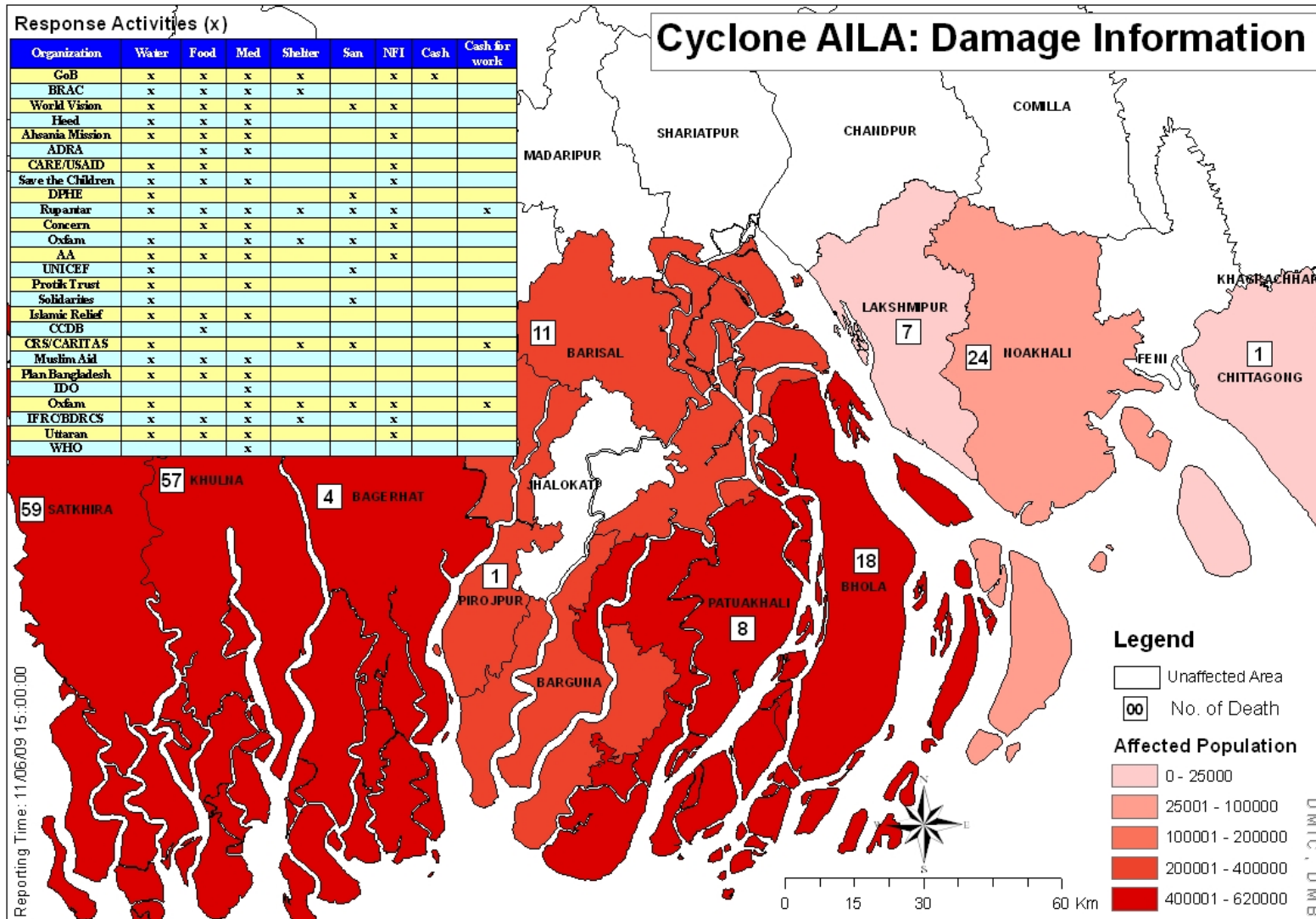
